New Lehrhaus Annual Report – FY 2022-23

We resurrected Lehrhaus Judaica as **NEW LEHRHAUS** just under two years ago and it has been a stunning success. Our website and e-newsletter has grown to over 2200 subscribers. In the past fiscal year, 3,875 students registered for our programs (over 7,500 registrations since inception). We have offered 66 different programs over the course of the year including onesession presentations, multi-session courses (usually 4 sessions) and year-long language classes and Talmud Circles. Program videos have been viewed 5,745 times (10,975 since inception)



The response from the community

Enthusiastic responses from students and event participants follow most of our programs with 89% rating the program they attended as "excellent" or "very good." We have received numerous emails thanking us for resurrecting Lehrhaus and offering stellar programs.

Community outreach

We have partnered with numerous organizations in the Bay Area Jewish community from synagogues and JCCs to Urban Adamah, KlezCalifornia, Manny's Café in San Francisco and, coming soon, BASE-Bay. We've also partnered with distinguished organizations outside the Bay Area including YIVO and Jewish Food Society (both based in New York) and the Taube Center for Jewish Life & Learning in Warsaw.

Our students

- About 55% or our students are veteran Lehrhaus Judaica/HaMaqom students. The newcomers have been very enthusiastic, far exceeding our expectations.
- 68% of students who did not self-identify as "already deeply engaged in Jewish life" responded to the statement "As a result of this program (or other New Lehrhaus programs), I am more likely to participate in another Jewish life experience" with "very likely" or "likely."
- We have increased the number of programs geared toward younger and more diverse audiences, e.g., programs at Urban Adamah in Berkeley, Manny's Café in San Francisco for a total of seven programs already held and several more planned for fall 2023.
- We initiated social media outreach with six campaigns between September 2022 and September 23. As a result, we added 140 new subscribers. <u>Examples:</u>

Thanks to our very generous mega donors and significant savings realized by not hiring an Executive Director in this fiscal year (the E.D. serving pro bono). We were able to create a substantial reserve as an Agency Fund held by the Jewish Community Federation Endowment, for future use.
